Christmas in the Crystal City

Picture a storybook town, gentle snow, Santa, reindeer, a winter parade and shops decorated to the nines for the holidays. All of this and more can be found in Corning, nestled in south central New York State south of Watkins Glen, during Crystal City Christmas celebration, on the three weekends immediately following Thanksgiving.

The festival is sure to delight your children, get you into the holiday spirit and take it easy on your wallet. Each weekend, visitors are offered low rates (between \$90 and \$138 for two nights plus breakfast and a family night) at local horels. This bargain also includes admission to area museums and attractions and a discount shopping pass; as well as each weekend's special free Christmas events, including a tree lighting, caroling, Parade of Lights (a spectacular parade in which everything is covered with lights), Sparkle of Christmas Festival, and the Beary Merry Christmas Celebration (with a teddy bear theme). Santa resides in a glass house in the center

of town and his reindeer make special appearances as well. Horse drawn carriages are available, as well as hay rides.

Take hands with the family and mosey on down the tree-lined pathway — all adorned with fine white lights — towards the park's entrance. (But keep your purse-closed, because admission is FREE). The sounds of the season fill the air as brass hands and Yuletide carolers clad in top hats small about the lane. On fine approach,



the small village shops, with their ornate trim, resemble something out of Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol. Old-fashioned window displays with motorized scenes fill storefronts. There are a myriad of confectionaries, coffee houses, and boutiques stocked with unique holiday gifts and collectibles. Go in to get warm, but then keep on walking because there are more than 20 rides and attractions up ahead (just pay

as you go), including Santa's workshop, complete with 9 live reindeer.

Warm up with some hot cocoa or grab a bite to eat at one of the hot food vendors before going back out into the chilly night air. Be prepared to stop and sing along with the variety of local musical groups who appear daily at the Candylane Choir Loft. Or duck inside the cozy, heated Music Box Theatre for a live singing and dancing show. Then hop aboard the Candylane Twilight Express for a steampowered train trip through Santa's Magical Forest. After disembarking, head back down through Candylane. Stop off for a nostalgic ride on the old carousel, shake hands with a few of the Hershey product characters and, before departing, don't forget to eat some chocolate. After all, Hershey is the sweetest place on Earth.

Savor a traditional American Christmas dinner with incredible chocolate desserts and enjoy a troupe of professional performers who entertain with songs and stories of the season.
